	1. In Bloom. Town looked fantastic on judging day. A lot of hard work went into weeding and litter picking by a great number of people including painting of some of the street furniture. Judges commented on improvements they noted from previous visit, and appreciated new sites brought in (Moody St, Antrobus St, Bath House etc) PP advised the group that the Schools 'Space Garden' display in the Polytunnel is now open to the public (Sat / Sun 2 to 4.00pm throughout August and hopefully into September)and receiving some great comments.	
	2. RHS Tatton. High winds resulted in the tremendous trees having to be removed from our display, therefore our entry was not eligible for judging. We did however get some good comments generally about the site.	
	The Trench Garden created by LOL not only drew many favourable comments and gained a Merit Award for 'Interpretation of a World Event, but also resulted in many good contacts being made with other allotment holders and a potential sponsorship opportunity generated.

PM finalised and submitted a letter of objection on behalf of CSG to this proposed development.

2. Seddon Homes – 230 homes off Canal Road

In preparation for the upcoming appeal in September to the refusal of the original planning application PM, with the help of Anna Morrison, completed a travel survey of the Canal Road and Howey Lane areas – only limited assessment of the results have been done to date.

A replacement (slightly revised) planning application was submitted by Seddon Homes last year and this will go to the Strategic Planning Board on 29th July. PM is preparing to represent CSG and will oppose the recommendation for approval. *This was refused by the planning board on the day.*

3. Congleton Neighbourhood Plan – Transport Group

PM and P Hall attended the Neighbourhood Plan open day on 8th July, representing the Transport Group. The open day was not that well attended by members of the public.

The Transport Group met on 11th July to consider the possible measures that could be included in the NP and what evidence would be needed to support these.

PM met with Tom Evans and Cllr David Brown on 15th July to discuss the evidence base for the proposed transport measures in the NP. The evidence base may not be as onerous as originally expected but Tom did say that costly infrastructure measures are likely to be unaffordable.

4. CEBC Local Plan

CEBC has issued their response to the issues raised by the Inspector and this has resulted in an increase in housing numbers assigned to Congleton – up from 3500 to 4150. Furthermore CEBC have suggested that to accommodate these additional figures the land off Waggs Road, Canal Road (Seddon as above) and at Tall Ash Farm needs to be included in the plan. PM will

resist all of these – Waggs Road was refused at appeal on road safety grounds and there are serious road safety issues with both the others – in addition there are other issues why these sites should not be included.

Cheshire East have drafted a 'Cycle Strategy' and this is currently out for comments

There are a lot of general statements designed to make us all feel warm about the cycle provision that is being proposed. The fact is that only with cross department agreement and sufficient funds, will the cycle provisions will happen. Please let everyone have the link and urge them to comment. The draft consultation is open until 14 Sept. Once it has been considered and revised,

Please take part in the CEBC cycling consultation. it will be published for full public consultation.

One of the proposed outcomes of the Strategy is a detailed cycle network map of Congleton that will inform the Neighbourhood Plan. We have the basis for this already and CCC, SECCAG and Sustrans will all feed into this.

2 Sustrans Rangers propose to survey the Biddulph Valley Way with a view to putting up directional signage along, off and leading into the BVW. A leisure map of the whole BVW from Congleton to Stoke station is proposed.

Jo Money took offence at CCC's last report where we suggested that we had been 'stuck' in the Community Gardens and therefore did not get a lot of footfall. I believe that Food4Free had a similar feeling of isolation last year and thus moved to Mill St. (See Jo's letter to CSG, this indicates that she is already planning to improve this situation for next year)

As stated in the last CCC report we are looking to use Market Square next year.
