	Town Centre Report - J.MacArthur
	1. <b>Town Centre:</b> Town centres have been having it tough all over the country with the continuing increase of on-line sales, financial squeeze on many families and higher costs of goods. The public realm works have added to the difficulties facing traders in Congleton, but thankfully this is coming to an end. It is anticipate that at least three of the five empty units in the pedestrian area will be filled in the near future. Rumba now has a new premises licence and planning permission for the former Maskery property on Swan Bank and Planning Permission has been submitted for a new restaurant in the High Street. Current we are around 90% occupied with 185 shops filled out of 203 rentable/ marketed units.
	2. <b>Public Realm</b> - this is still expected to be finished by the end of the month. The contractors are currently working on correction work in the road. The section from Boots to Card Factory will be worked on next week (week commencing 11 March). Thursday and Friday this week the contractors are working on replacing kerb stones in the pedestrian area. The Town Council has submitted a list of areas that needs some


work which has been passed onto Cheshire East Highways.

3. The **footfall camera** in the pedestrian area is now able to compare year on year figures. At the moment this doesn't make for good reading. Last week was the lowest since we started recording – although with the freezing temperatures and snow this was expected.

- 4. **Makers Market** Victoria Crane, Director of the Makers Market, has spoken to most of the shops in the High Street and Pedestrian area. The shops were very positive about a Makers Market setting up in Congleton. Some are adamant that it should be on a Saturday, others particular those not on the pedestrian area thought Sunday. Overall Saturday seems the most popular choice. It is most likely that the Congleton Makers Market will be on the last Saturday of the month aware that Treacle is the last Sunday but believe there is scope for Congleton to have its own the day before. Expected start date is the 28<sup>th</sup> April.
- 5. **Easter Treats** Planning to bring back the Egg Roll and Easter fun and games on the 3<sup>rd</sup> April in the Town Centre. Hopefully by then the pedestrian works will be complete. Also contacting shops to set up an Easter Egg hunt around the shops.
- 6. **Calendar of Events 2018** work on a leaflet to be sent near and far highlighting Congleton's programme of events for 2018 including the new Heritage and Antiques two week festival in September.
- 7. **Congleton in Bloom** on 6<sup>th</sup> Feb we were officially told that Congleton is in the National in Bloom finals 2018. First Spring Clean was postponed until 17<sup>th</sup> March due to the snow and freezing temperatures! Judging likely to be the 2 or 3 August for Britain in Bloom and 10 days or so earlier for North West in Bloom. The annual In Bloom survey is open until the end of March please take a few minutes to fill it in.

## 5. Community Projects - J.Money

It was a quiet and very cold January spent on writing a comprehensive **5 year Business Plan** for the next step for the Picture House. But also staring to work on the following:

**Letters of War** project – MY Theatre – working with Jackie MacArthur supporting the project, fund raising and organising the performance in the Town Hall. Last performance on 14<sup>th</sup> February was very well received and over 100 kids took part. Next performance is on March 21<sup>st</sup>. Please contact Jackie or myself if you wish to attend.

**Promenade Theatre Day** – refer to report from Electric Picture House regarding 6 workshops for children aged 7-12 to devise including writing the play, casting, scenery and costume making, stage management and direction and performing their own play on the day. Liaising with MMU students for their 4 pieces performed around the Town. Hosting the professional performance in the evening.

**Food and Drink Festival** Sunday June 10<sup>th</sup> - on going planning. 70 stalls booked, all vetted for top quality produce and food to go with an average distance mileage of stallholders being 34miles. Road closures in place and stall company booked. Currently working on entertainment, Town Hall activities and 10 year anniversary celebrations. Thinking of making a giant replica of the Town Hall out of chocolate brownies – work in progress.

**Carnival Parade** – planning, booking bands etc marketing, fund raising, road closures, marshals etc

Planning to organise some **town decoration** public art workshops for the summer.

**GRIPP assurance** – started the process with the CVS to ensure the Governance/Resources/Information/People and Places are all in order and update.

Attended **SHIFT and WEAVE Symposium** in Macclesfield, 13<sup>th</sup> February, on the development of digital arts and industries. It was a very interesting event and I made some good contacts and did some good networking.

### **ELECTRIC PICTURE HOUSE**

The Electric Picture House continues to build strong links and partnerships with the community and has had a busy start to 2018.

We are now on our second exhibition of the year called Duo (or 2) with work by artists Bruce Lyons and Petra Lea. There is some fantastic artwork on display so please come and take a look, it is on until Saturday 7th April.

We have also started workshops for people living with Dementia and their carers at the Old Saw Mill and these continue until 21st March. Visyon visited us to take part in a ceramic workshop to create flowers for their new garden space.

We have Hidden Places Promenade Theatre Day coming up on Saturday 5th May with performances by a group of local children, Manchester Metropolitan University students and a professional touring company.

We will be holding workshops for children aged 7-12 to create their own play, direct, act, make scenery and costumes, design posters etc. This will then be performed as part of the Hidden Places theatre day.

Our professional performance is by Sam Brady and is called Things I Say When I Don't Say I Love You and was created as part of the Lowry's 'Developed With' programme. It is a poignant and perfectly judged one-man play about male relationships within one family when dealing with a life changing dementia diagnosis.

#### **CONGLETON UNPLUGGED 2018**

Congleton Unplugged just held their annual event 15 venues, 46 bands, and despite the weather a very well attended event. Trying to generate a more diverse crowd, brought Music Gofer in to help organise artists for the event, and this was very successful, will consider using them again. Too soon yet to determine overall outcome, but early signs good. Will look at shuffling some of the news gigs around, eg the Ceilidh probably better on the Saturday afternoon/early evening.

The CHAF, events will be centric on Congleton, also the Old Hall at Biddulph Grange, Gawsworth Hall and Little Moreton Hallevents across the three weekends. CC have facilitated marketing and promotion ideas also some networking, working with ADprofile.	
Senior Forum - S Akers Smith	
Dementia Steering Group (Dementia Friendly Congleton) is going from strength to strength. We are half way to our Dementia Friends Target for 2018. (TGT 250, achieved 134) with a widening range of Businesses, Organisations and Health Services coming on board. Activity programme for Congleton showing activity across 6 days per week, JMac putting together a more professional leaflet. We now have a regular column in The Chronicle. Health and Wellbeing Fayre. This is planned for Tuesday 2 <sup>nd</sup> October and will be a joint project with Mid Cheshire Health Trust. Subgroup meeting planned for 27 <sup>th</sup> March, more details at the June meeting.

Heritage Trail – waiting for development form TMC. We are no loger a developer of the scheme, but a potential customer.	
Mountbatten Way – 7 more large planters and tubs being sites which will give us 19 trees in total plus the 5 pear trees in Back St carpark in our drive to "green" Mountbatten Way.

Cenotaph Funding Commitment.	

MS took us through the history of the Cenotaph Refurbishment project from conception in 2013 to the current day.

Since rejection for funding of the scheme by HLF we have redesigned the whole project, worked with CEBC on restoration of the Colehill Bank wall, some tree work to both protect the walls integrity and public safety and now have full planning permission to deliver the project.

MS has written to various organisations asking for letters of support (7 received currently) ,we have had coverage of the plan in The Chronicle and a public exhibition last October in The Town hall (Great War Exhibition).

We are now starting on a funding drive. MS asked the Executive to commit £10k for the next 2 years from The Partnerships funds to kick off the fundraising effort. After discussion and a lot of very positive comment, PA proposed that we commit to this request, it was seconded by GW and passed by a unanimous vote.

We are now looking for financial support from Congleton Town Council before going out to major funders and local trusts. We have already received a donation from a resident and Congleton lions, with a promise of a fundraising event by New Life Church.
